COOP – Continuity of Operations Plan

DEFINITION:

Continuity of operations planning means the internal effort of an organization to assure that the capability exists to continue essential functions and services in response to a comprehensive array of potential emergencies or disasters

- Essential functions and key personnel
- •Vital records, systems and equipment
- •Alternate work sites
- •Communications
- •Training and exercises



BEAP – Building Emergency Action Plan

- O Building, Floor or Area name
- O Severe weather shelter areas
- O Shelter location from an outdoor chemical release
- O Designated assembly area
- O Doors or areas that lock
- O Distribution of the plan
- O Practice!!!



Get out, Stay put, Decide

Get Out - Evacuations:

- Fire
- Criminal activity
- Chemical accident inside

Stay Put - Shelter:

- Tornado warnings
- Severe weather
- Earthquake
- Chemical Accident outside

Decide - Active shooter:

- Run
- Hide
- Fight



Medical Emergencies

- Emergency contact information considerations
- Call 911 and don't hang up
- Give your location and type of emergency
- Any information on the victim
- Send someone outside to meet responders
- First Aid, CPR and AED considerations
